Legend


TRF – The Rotary Foundation

Up to \$25,000 per year available


Government of Canada funds through The **Rotary Foundation of Canada (TRFC)**

Water is Life, Uganda





Water is Life – Sanitation is Health Uganda - Global Grant 1525222

- \$300,000 US project.
- 6,000 children in 10 schools and their community of 17,000.
- Project at request of WASRAG & RI.









The Project

- Water & Sanitation education and training for schoolchildren, teachers, parents, water technicians and many more.
- Bio-sand water filters, water harvesting tanks and latrines for 10 schools.
- Training some community members to be able to build bio-sand filters, latrines and water harvesting tanks for households.
- Menstrual Hygiene Management including reusable pads.







Funding in USD



- \$ 50,000 Rotary Club of Calgary
- \$250,000 from 37 different Rotary clubs and Rotary Districts in 8 countries, including the match from our Rotary Foundation.
- A special thank you to Rotarian Bill Davis of Houston Texas for finding much of this funding.

The Rotary Club of El Cerrejon has experience with safe water projects using Bio Sand Filters and water wells. They will serve as the general contractor for three water wells to be built on land-locked family farms, bring cleaning water to communities.




Province of Herat, Afghanistan



Malaria Project Objective


- The purchase and distribution of insecticide treated bed nets to pregnant women, the elderly, and children under the age of five.
- Reinforcement of the importance of Malaria treatment in each country's healthcare plan.











Africa -

Malaria treatment now exceeds 40% of public Healthcare spend







Why Malaria: Six Reasons

- Leading cause of mortality and morbidity worldwide, especially in sub-Sahara Africa where 90% of Malaria deaths occur.
- 2. Obstacles to social and economic development.

3. 40% of public health expenditure









Why Malaria: Six Reasons

Relatively easy and inexpensively preventable & treatable.

Malaria kills more Africans than HIV/AIDS.

5. Both UNICEF and Rotary International Healthcare Committee acknowledge that Malaria has a significant impact on its transmission, worsening and ultimate death from HIV/AIDS.




