Covid-19 Update

At the beginning of the pandemic in March, **80** employees out of **130** were temporarily laid off or on leave and within six months, roughly half (**41**) of the employees have gone back to work. **Five** employees have permanently been laid off due to COVID19.

Job development came to a halt as the economy shut down in March, however, within three months, job development became increasingly busy as coordinators worked with new and existing employment partnerships, **21** new jobs in July, August and September.
