What We Fund

<u>Cornerstone Youth Centre</u> Cornerstone Youth Centre is a free, after school drop-in center, located in a small bungalow in the heart of Mayland Heights and open our doors daily to youth grades 6-9, to provide a safe and caring place for kids to go after school for sports, homework help, hot food, and mentoring.

<u>Providence</u> At Providence we believe that every child deserves a chance to reach for and achieve their full potential. Working with the child, family and community, Providence provides the opportunity to build foundations that will last a lifetime. We are grateful for the support of Rotary in purchasing 10 safety seats.



<u>Women's Empowerment Night.</u> The event aims to provide Calgary women with access to resources, services, and free giveaways that foster physical, mental, and social well-being. Women's Empowerment Night was initiated by students from the Student Run Clinic (SRC) at the University of Calgary Faculty of Medicine in 2010.

The 1835 Recovery Acres Calgary Society House The 1835 House Fundraising event support the important work of fighting addiction. For over 40 years, Recovery Acres Society has provided a highly effective, residential treatment program, helping over 13,000 men overcome drug and alcohol abuse.
