Now that we have housed our survivors, drinking water is the key to progress in developing countries as it improves health and facilitates quick recovery following natural disasters.

The water filtration system will produce up to 1 million gallons of clean water.



Our Statistics

Each year we receive more than 35 requests for small donations.

- Approximately one in three projects received funding.
- On average one or two projects are given to the Major Donations Committee.
- In 2016-17 we donated \$37709 to 16 different agencies.
- Since 2014 we have supported 49 agencies with a total of \$121000.
